The impact of Connected Communities work at Staffordshire University



In 2022-23, Staffordshire University tested the Connected Communities Evaluation Framework. This framework evaluates social, community, or cultural events aimed at benefiting the public or civil society partners.

The purpose of the Connected Communities Evaluation is to understand our collective impact as an engaged civic university.

Last year we worked with Staffs CAN to be advised on how the document could be edited and developed on in this year's report and for future years.

Public Engagement Innovation Grants

STAFFORDSHIRE UNIVERSITY'S PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT INNOVATION GRANTS



Our team have recently launched Public Engagement Innovation Grants (PEIG) for members of staff to apply for at Staffordshire University. The grants are designed to help university staff to collaborate with and share information, expertise, ideas, or experiences with members of the public and community organisations.

We asked members of the Staffs CAN network to join the decision making panel for the grants to make sure that community voices could be involved with the process.

On 21st March the panel met to make the decisions. In total 7 grants have been awarded PEIG funding.

We want to take the opportunity to thank all members of Staffs CAN that showed an interest and especially to the two members that supported us to make decisions. We hope to involve members of the Staffs CAN in future activities such as this!

Raising Voices: Taking Action



Raising Voices: Taking Action is a project led by All the Small Things CIC, Expert Citizens CIC and Staffordshire University that aims to connect people to discuss the issues that create and make poverty worse in Stoke-on-Trent and empower them to act as a collective.

The new project aims to build on the impact that has been made in Get Talking Hardship (2019) and Raising Voices (2021).



To help us take action we will be holding Chat for Change events, across the city. Chat for Change is an opportunity to join other people

to talk about poverty in a safe place over a hot drink and a piece of cake.

Chat for Change events are free to all. Bring your kids, friends and family. Share your ideas and find out about how we can take action on poverty together! Chat for Change sessions will be held across the city, in different community spaces.
